“Working with art and children is a passion. My non-traditional way of teaching allows the child to learn making art using actual tools and supplies”, says Sherrie Hiller. She has fifteen years of experience instructing children, (3-14 years of age) in art education. From 1998 to 2003 Sherrie would go in monthly to Mount Carmel Nursery School and Pre-K to introduce a new art medium to the 3-5 year olds.

She taught afterschool classes at The Art Studio at Sanford Barn and Alice Peck Elementary School in Hamden, Connecticut in 1999 and she also designed and implemented Kindergarten and First grade art workshops for Minds in Motion, the Connecticut Association for the talented and gifted in 2003.

At this time she worked on neighborhood projects, (i.e. clay figures, sculptures, painting, and using mixed media) and art in public places as a Visual Artist and Production Coordinator for the International Arts and Ideas Festival in New Haven, Connecticut.

Appointed to a position the Hamden Arts Commission by the Major of Hamden, Connecticut, in 1999 Sherrie chaired the committee for the Family Saturday Afternoon Series for six years. This committee planned ongoing art enrichment activities and entertainment programs.

Moving to Vermont in 2006 she instructed mixed medium art classes and jewelry making at Edmunds Elementary and Middle schools in Burlington, Artist’s Mediums in Williston, and Creative Habitat. Annette’s own Clubhouse Summer Campers experienced different art processes working with clays, paints, found objects, and recyclables under the instruction from Sherrie.
